#### What are Senior Transportation Services?

The mission of Senior Transportation Services [STS] is to assist older residents of Berlin, Meriden, New Britain, Southington, Wallingford and Plainville, ages 55 and over, to live independently in their own homes. STS Volunteer Drivers provide curb to curb, safe, reliable and economical healthcare transportation to out of town appointments, pharmacies and care facilities to visit loved ones. This allows our clients to age in place without being homebound.

#### **Donating to STS**

With gas prices fluctuating, it's getting more and more expensive to fund our volunteer drivers to provide rides. STS implements a small per mile stipend to our drivers monthly, along with ensuring drivers have sanitary items as needed. We always welcome large contributions, but because we serve families and seniors with limited incomes, even the smallest contribution goes a long way.

Across all 6 communities that STS serves, 78% of transportation provided is of no cost to our clients. With donations and contributions that come in monthly, \$50.00 worth of donations will provide 1 round trip ride and \$100.00 would support 2 round trip rides. STS wants to be transparent as to how our funding is redirected right back to the organization, and in turn back to our community.

The office staff and board members would like to thank everyone who has donated to Senior Transportation Services Inc.! Our company exists only through individual donations, Grants and Sponsorships. If you would like to make a donation to help us continue our services, you can:

#### **Ride Notations - Clients**

<u>Mobility Adjustments</u> - If there are changes in mobility for a client (canes, walkers and/or oxygen tanks) please notify the office so that we can update your file. The better informed we are about any special circumstances, the better we are able to assist both the clients and having the drivers aware of the situation.

<u>Appointment Reminders</u> - We are currently taking appointments up to one year in advance. As our client volume is increasing, it is always a good idea to get your appointments in the system as soon as possible.

<u>10 Day Notice</u> - We are starting to get stricter with the 10-working day rule. Appointments have to be made at least 10 business days prior your appointment, not including weekends or holidays.

<u>Parking Fees</u> - If a parking fee is required (parking garage, parking lot, or space with parking meters), it is the client's responsibility to pay the charge.

<u>Additional Stops</u> - After your medical appointment, drivers can make pharmacy or bank stops during a scheduled ride. Please let the office know prior to your appointment because office approval is needed for secondary stops.

We need your help! Please let your friends and relatives know about what STS does. If you are in the doctor's office mention STS to the doctor, nurse, receptionist and other patients in the waiting room. You as our clients are our biggest advocates! We want to spread the word about our organization to grow and add more towns to our coverage.

STS is always trying to improve our service and get the word out that we are here to help! If you know of any friends, family or loved ones who we can assist through our organization, please let them know that we are here to offer our support. If you have any questions, please contact the office.

## **Frequently Asked Questions**

Question: When will I be picked up to get to my medical appointment?

**Answer**: Drivers will contact our clients the day prior to their appointment to introduce themselves as your driver and discuss what pick-up time would work best for the both of you. If clients have a later afternoon appointment, it is common for drivers to reach out the morning of the appointment to then arrange the pick-up time.
