That's why we offer free transportation to our low-income clients, ensuring they can get to their medical appointments without worry. Free Ride Totals January-March 2024:

Total number of free rides provided in the communities: 809 total free rides!

Total number of rides provided in all 6 communities: 1,065 total rides!

Total mileage driven by volunteer drivers: **15,980** total miles! Total hours completed by volunteer drivers: **889** total hours!

Town of Berlin: 28 rides were free!

Town of Meriden: 35 rides were free!

Town of New Britain: 243 rides were free!

Town of Plainville: 55 rides were free!
